Mandatory Quality Assurance

Quality Assurance training is MANDATORY FOR ANYONE TAKING A LIVING, BREATHING ANIMAL PROJECT TO THE FAIR. This must be completed by June 1.

Ashland County 4-H will hold QA trainings on

- **March 20, 27 and 28 at 6pm on the Fairgrounds in Mozelle Hall.**
- **April 10 and 17 at 6pm on the Fairgrounds in Mozelle Hall.**

Other options to complete this mandatory QA training are:

- **Ohio Junior Swine Day**
- **Ohio Youth Poultry Clinic in Wooster**
- **Hammertime Show Clinic by Northwestern FFA**

Quality Assurance Test Out Option

Youth ages 12 - 18 as of January 1, 2024 are eligible to take a test to fulfill their QA requirement.

4-H members aged 15 and over who pass the test will be exempt from the quality assurance requirement for the rest of their 4-H/FFA career. Members aged 12-14 who pass the test are marked complete for their QA requirement until the year they turn 15. At that time, they will need to attend QA training or take the age 15-18 QA test.



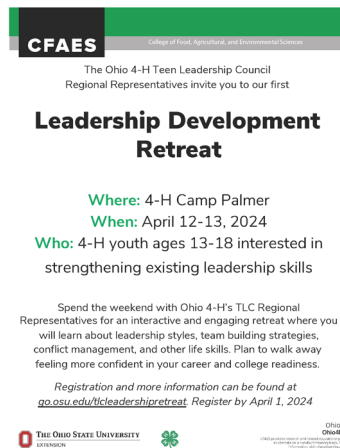

We ask that once again, 4-H Clubs collect project book orders from their members. This helps us keep costs down by ordering only the books that will be needed for this year.

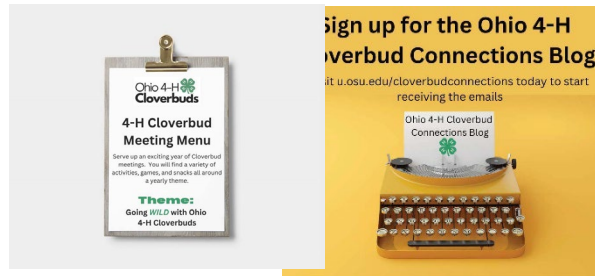

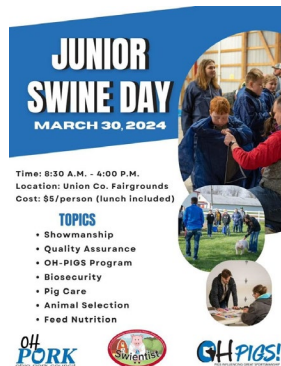

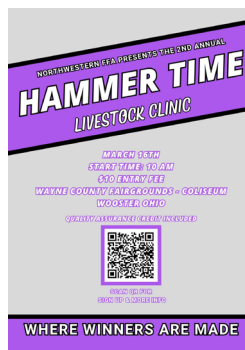

2024 Equistep: Mandatory Each Year for Anyone Taking a Horse Project

EquiSTEP (Equine Safety, Training, and Education Program) is an **ANNUAL** statewide requirement for all youth participating in Ohio 4-H Horse Program activities and/or enrolled in a 4-H horse project. Must be completed by **MAY 1** to eligible to show.

To complete this requirement, go to <http://go.osu.edu/equistep2024>

- Enroll using you own unique email address. **DO NOT** use your school email addresses as the course enrollment invitation will be blocked by the school's email system.
- **MAKE SURE TO ANSWER THE QUESTION THAT ASKS WHAT COUNTY YOU ARE FROM AND CLICK THE LAST RED ARROW TO SUBMIT AFTER THE FEEDBACK SURVEY.** Otherwise, our office does not get notified that you have completed the course.
- You will receive a confirmation email from Equistep when you have successfully completed the course. Keep this confirmation email for your records.

4-H Enrollment is Open! Volunteers please log in and Enroll Now!

Enrollment in 4-H is in full swing. You must enroll in 4-H by APRIL 15 to be eligible to show the Fair. Log into <https://v2.4honline.com/> and enroll in 4-H for 2023-24.

- **Cloverbuds:** Enroll in Project 710 Cloverbud Activities
- **COMMITTEE MEMBERS:** Enroll as a PROGRAM VOLUNTEER, then choose your committee as your "unit". DO NOT select any projects.
- **Club advisors,** enroll as a Club Volunteer with your club. DO NOT select any projects.
- **Volunteers** will not be approved until they have met all requirements, including annual advisor training to be offered early in 2024.
- **HORSE Members:** New Projects with project books include 186 Gymkhana Animal Sciences and 187 Roping Animal Sciences. You must be enrolled in 187 Roping if you want to participate in ground roping classes. For Ohio State Fair and Ashland County PAS shows, the 187 Roping Project book will be required. Part of your score at the Ohio State Fair will be from your roping project book. If you want to participate in the State competitive trail ride in September, you must be enrolled in 188 Trail Riding project.

FFA Members in 4Honline

Any FFA member that is taking ANY animal to the fair, will need make a 4Honline account if they do not already have one.

- **FFA Members:** Choose "yes, I want to enroll in 4-H". When you choose your FFA chapter as your club, the system is set up to realize you are not actually enrolled in a 4-H club.
- Please list your FFA chapter as your "club".
- Choose COP: Animal, FFA (market goat, dairy cow, market hog, etc..) as your project.

Ohio State Fair Ownership Deadline UPDATED

Ohio State Animal Sciences reached out to the counties this week with information that some Ohio State Fair Ownership deadlines have CHANGED from the information we had been provided earlier.

The dates below supercede any dates that had been published earlier. If you plan to exhibit at the Ohio State Fair, your animal MUST BE IDENTIFIED in your 4Honline profile by the date below.

- **MARKET ANIMALS –**
 - **Market beef – January 1**
 - **Market swine – May 23**
 - **Market lambs – May 23**
 - **Market goats – May 1**
 - **Dairy feeders – June 1**
 - **Market rabbits – June 1**
 - **Market poultry – within 5 days of hatch**

BREEDING ANIMALS –

- **Breeding Sheep – May 22**
- **Breeding Beef – May 22**
- **Breeding Swine – May 22**
- **Breeding Goats – May 16**
- **Breeding Poultry – May 31**
- **Breeding rabbits – May 31**
- **Dairy Cattle – May 22**

BEEF Department

- **All cattle must arrive with 840 EID in place**
 - **15-digit number starting with 840**
 - **Breeding can use tattoo as SECONDARY ID**
- **BVD testing required for all cattle**
 - **exception of Commercial Cattle**
 - **One test good for lifetime**
- **BEEF BREEDING**
 - ***Crossbred breeding heifers will be required to submit a DNA packet with 840 EID tag information, reach out to Andi Hershey for packets (a.hershey@expo.ohio.gov)***
 - ***Due Date: Postmarked by June 1st***

DOG Department

- **Show starts, June 17th**

SWINE Department:

- **The Jr Swine Show requires ALL hogs to have:**
 - **840 tag**
 - **Premise ID**
- **To exhibit breeding swine, must be enrolled in the project at the county level**

Other Ohio State Fair updates and reminders

General:

- **Exhibitors MUST be enrolled in the project they want to exhibit at the state fair, even if the county doesn't offer it at fair (i.e., swine breeding).**
- **All Junior Exhibitors must enter their projects online.**
 - **No late market or breeding (new 2024) entries**

- BVD testing required for all cattle
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DOG Department

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SWINE Department:
