Rabbit Tattooing

Joan Stauffer will be available to tattoo breeding rabbits TODAY. Please call her at 419-651-3068 to set up an appointment.

Breeding rabbits need to be tattooed and entered in the member's 4Honline by June 1 to be eligible to show at the fair.

Quality Assurance Training Deadline June 1

Any 4-H or FFA member taking a live, breathing animal to the fair, must attend a Quality Assurance training before June 1. Ashland County does not have anymore QA training dates available, but members may:

- Find and attend another county that is offering QA before June 1.
- Complete QA online at https://yqcaprogram.org/ Cost for online QA is \$12. If you choose the online option, you must email your certificate of completion to the Extension Office.

Beef/Dairy Feeders & Market Animals Need Tagged and Entered in 4Honline by June 1

If you have a market animal or beef/dairy feeder, you will need to tag your animal with an ear tag from the Extension Office by June 1.

Sheep, goat and feeders will have the 840 EID tags.

This year, swine tags will be the traditional fair tag (not 840 EID tags) due to an issue with our tag order. If your animal already has an 840 EID tag, do not remove it. You should record that 840 EID tag number in 4Honline. If you need an 840 EID tag for your hog to show at the State Fair, please contact your breeder, vet or the Extension Office.

- · Hog tags should be placed in the RIGHT ear for ease of viewing during fair check in.
- Sheep/Goat/Feeder tags can be placed in either ear and as the picture above shows.
- Enter the ENTIRE 15 DIGIT EID TAG NUMBER IN THE RFID tag number location in 4Honline.
- You will receive an email from 4Honline stating your animal is approved or has "been sent back". If your
 animal submission is sent back, please read the reason why in the email from 4Honline, following the
 instructions and resubmit.

We are working on approving animals in 4Honline. While this is a priority to us, it is a manual process that takes quite some time, so please be patient while awaiting your confirmation of approval email. Once we approve your animal's identification submission, you will receive and email from 4Honline stating your animal has been approved. If your email from 4Honline states your animal has been "sent back", the reason will be stated in that email. Please follow the instructions and resubmit, knowing that the date/time of your original submission is recorded.

Identify Your Market/Feeder Calf/Dog/Breeding Rabbit in 4Honline by June 1!

All market animals (except poultry), beef/dairy feeders, dogs, and BREEDING RABBITS must be entered in the member's 4Honline profile by June 1. Market rabbits must be entered in 4Honline by August 28.

- NEW THIS YEAR: BREEEDING RABBITS must be entered in 4Honline by June 1.
 - If your animal has an 840 EID tag, ENTER IT IN THE RFID TAG NUMBER FIELD. YOU MUST ENTER ALL 15 DIGITS!! By entering all 15 digits, it will match when they scan your animal's tag at fair check in.
 - Beef/Dairy Feeders: You may also enter this 840 EID number in the second Tag number field that is required.
 - GOATS & SHEEP: Will have 2 tags in. The round 840 EID tag and their Scrapies tag from the breeder. Enter
 your ENTIRE Scrapies tag number in the Tag number field (OH-XXXX 123). The 840 EID tag number will be
 entered in the RFID tag field. We must be able to read the Scrapies tag and see EID tag in at least one of your
 photos! (Perhaps a close up picture in the identifier photo location)
 - Hogs: Enter your hog's tag number in the Tag number field that is required. We must be able to read the number on your hog's tag in at least one of your uploaded pictures.

The event is being hosted by the Ohio Department of Natural Resources and is open to all 4-H members across Ohio! Best of all the event is FREE!



Ohio Administrative Code Livestock Exhibition Rules

When reviewing the *OAC 901-19* (Ohio Administrative Code Livestock Exhibition Rules), here is a document to help clarify definitions and understand the expectations that must be met for all youth Junior Livestock Exhibitions in Ohio. https://ashland.osu.edu/sites/ashland/files/imce/Ohio%20Youth%20Livestock%20Exhibition%20Rules%204.17.23.pdf

- PLEASE NOTE: counties may have ADDITIONAL rules in place and guidelines to meet, in order to be eligible to
 exhibit. For Example: The deadline for Quality Assurance completion in Ashland Co. is June 1- even though it is
 well before the 45 day deadline outlined in this document)
- Please refer to Project Guidelines on our website and the Jr Fair Book for additional information on county specific rules.

Livestock Project Judging

You will be required to come to project Livestock judging before the fair with a completed record book! You may reuse a current project book and update the topics of interest, project activities, youth parent agreement etc.(dates will need to reflect current year) however you are going to be required to have CURRENT YEAR, completed records, for each livestock project!

For example:

- If you have two market goats, that is the same project and those records may be combined in the same book
- If you have a breeding goat and a market goat, those are separate projects and will require separate records.
 You may use a second project book OR you may use the following tool--2023 Livestock Record--in addition to your one book to meet the record keeping requirement for the second project. If you keep another form of electronic records covering these items, you may print and submit those at judging.

<u>2023 Livestock Record</u>: Use if you are re-using a project book more than one year or need an additional record keeping tool. This ensures you have current year records for each project.

The record component will make up a significant portion of the members grade and the expectation is that each 4-H member will have completed records. It is recommended that an adult should review the record prior to judging.
