<u>Judging Time:</u> All of these projects will be judged on July 18 or August 2. Appointments for judging will be made online beginning June 1. The link to the sign up will be sent out in the weekly 4-H Email Newsletter. If you do not have internet access, you may call the Extension office at 419-281-8242 to make an appointment.

For all projects above bring the following to judging:

- Completed project book/records
- Educational display/item
- Any other items you would like to show the judge
- For all construction projects, bring pattern used and completed consumer shopping sheet.
- See the list below for additional specific items that must be brought/modeled for certain projects:

406: Model outfit made (minimum of two pieces or a one-piece garment with sleeves). Bring an example of one of your clothing repairs.

407: Model a minimum of one accessory made to complete each outfit and model that outfit.

408: Model costume made.

409: Model one item of clothing made from an "easy" or "beginner" pattern and bring pin cushion made.

410: Model one item from project book with selected outfit.

411: Model one garment using one or more embellishment techniques.

412: Bring completed outfit <u>or</u> three adapted garments for a person with a disability. "Other" is encouraged to come to judging and model outfit if current COVID and county guidelines allow.

413-417: Model garment made.

418: Model the outer layer of the lounging outfit made.

419: Model top with selected outfit.

420: Model advanced level coat, jacket or cape made.

424: Model outfit made. Bring an example of one of your clothing repairs.

425: Model outfit you have put together in the project. Bring an educational display about one of the activities in the book.

426: Model outfit made (minimum of two pieces). Bring an example of one of your clothing alteration/recycling experiences.

430: Bring an educational display from one of the activities in the project book. Model an outfit you have assembled from your wardrobe.

432M: Bring item(s) made in project and any other supporting material.
