Judging Time

For all projects above, bring the following to judging:

- One prepared food and it's recipe. If it is a hot/cold food, come prepared to keep it hot/cold during judging. Member should pay attention to presentation and cleanliness of items brought to judging.
- Completed project book
- A breakfast, lunch, dinner and snack menu for one day that includes the food exhibited.
- Bring appropriate table service for the food you have prepared.

See the list below for additional specific items that must be brought for certain projects:

461: Bring two different quick breads.

462: Bring two different breads from two different mixing methods.

462, 467, 469, 476: Bring cost per serving of the prepared food brought.

For project #486 bring completed project book and an educational display about one of the activities completed in the project.
