Judging

- If doing the home visit, the judge will look at garden plot(s) during judging.
- For office judging, bring completed project book/ records and photos of your garden and bring a selection of flowers or vegetables grown for examination by the judge.

Ashland County Junior Fair Exhibit:

- 1. Make a Junior Fair entry for your project online before the August deadline.
- 2. Bring your Educational display or item made to display at the fair.
- 3. If bringing plant material follow these guidelines: Annual flowers an arrangement of 3 to 5 types; vegetables - a collection of 3 to 5 types grown.
